NHPTV Moving Ahead with Production

Earlier this year we updated you on an important initiative with NH Public Television. The project, NH TAPPED, is a multiplatform program designed to educate and enlighten residents about drinking water history, infrastructure, challenges and solutions for keeping the Granite State's drinking resources safe for human consumption.

The programming will consist of a 30-minute documentary around water issues. Additionally, there will be a series of 1-minute interstitials which will direct traffic to the web where even more information will be available. The initiative will also include educational outreach in the local schools and the programming will be featured on the Planet Granite website, www.nhptv.org/plantegranite, with links to the video, activities, resources and partners.

Earlier this summer a meeting with stakeholders from around NH was held to brainstorm on the project's messaging. We recently were provided with an update that production for the documentary has begun. The crew has been visiting locations and filming footage. We anticipate the completed project will roll-out early next year around the time of the annual NH Drinking Water Festival.

NHWWA Members Recognized by EPA for Environmental Achievements

Congratulations to NHWWA members Jennifer Perry and Bill Meserve who were recently recognized at the 2016 Merit Awards Ceremony of the US Environmental Protection Agency's New England regional office for their environmental improvements in New Hampshire.

Jennifer and Bill were among a team of individuals representing communities, scientists and regulators that were honored for developing recommendations to affordably manage permits for wastewater and stormwater in Newfields, Exeter and Stratham. Recognized under the Environmental, Community, Academia & Nonprofit category, the efforts put forth by the Water Integration for Squamscott (WISE) project developed a guide for the three towns to support nitrogen load reduction and ways to monitor water quality results in an effort to provide ecosystem recovery in the Great Bay estuary. The project also delivered a means for communication between the regulators and municipalities with the local towns and other interested parties.

NHWWA congratulates Jennifer and Bill, and the entire WISE team on their recognition, and for their dedicated efforts in protecting the Squamscott River.

Each year EPA New England recognizes both individuals and groups in New England who have worked to protect or improve the region's environment. The Environmental Merit Awards have been given out since 1970 and are awarded in the categories of individual; business (including professional organizations); local, state or federal government; and environmental, community, academia or nonprofit organization. The awards honor individuals and groups who have shown particular ingenuity and commitment in their efforts.

2017 Local Source Water Protection Grants

Applications Available! Due November 1, 2016

Project funding is available from the Department of Environmental Services to develop and implement programs to protect existing sources of public drinking water. The grants are available to water suppliers, municipalities, regional planning agencies, non-profit organizations, educational institutions, conservation districts, and state agencies. Applicants can receive up to \$20,000 for projects to protect drinking water sources, including watershed planning, delineation of protection areas, assessment of threats to water supply sources, implementation, and source security. The application packet is available now to provide sufficient lead time for applicants to work with stakeholders and obtain compelling letters of commitment, which will be needed for some projects to score well in the competition for limited funds.

Construction Day 2016: One Day, Six Visits



One of the stops on August 3rd was the Sewalls Falls Bridge project in Concord.

On Wednesday, August 3, close to 60 people boarded a bus to tour the select locations for this year's Construction Day.

First stop, we visited the Bedford Hills Water Booster Station in Bedford, NH for a tour led by Bruce Lewis, Manager, Lewis Engineering. While there, attendees were able to observe Grundfos vertical turbine booster pumps which provide domestic and water for fire flow as a direct pressurization pumping station.

Next, the bus headed to Manchester Water Works (MWW) for two stops. The first was to MWW's Radial Collector Well (RCW) which will produce over 7 MGD and a system source redundancy on the west side of the Merrimack River. Construction of the RCW was completed in May of this year and it is designed to provide much needed additional supply for Manchester's customers in the future. David Miller, PE, Deputy Director, Manchester Water Works and Greg Smith, PG, CG, Lead Hydrogeologist, Wright Pierce, were onsite to present background information and answer questions about the project.

From there, Dave led the bus to MWW's newly erected water storage tanks where we met with Adam Yanulis, VP of Tighe & Bond, who was onsite to answer questions. NHWWA visited this site on last year's Construction Day when the storage tanks were in their early stages of development. The new and modern 6.5 million gallon AWWA D-110 wire-wound concrete water storage tanks replace the existing 140 year-old 20 MG earth-embankment reservoir.

After the stops in Manchester, the bus headed north to White Park in Concord for a quick break for lunch and then on to Penacook for a site visit where the city is undergoing water main replacement. Martha Drukker, Associate Engineer for the City of Concord, and Keith Patnode, Project Superintendent with S.U.R. Construction, Inc. met with the group to explain how the city is in the process of replacing 3,800 feet of 6" main, 700 feet of 8" main and removing 4 bleeders. From there, Martha led the group over to the Sewalls Falls Bridge for an up-close look at the bridge replacement project. Attendees were greeted by Mike Cole, General Superintendent, with E.D. Swett Inc. and Steve Delia, Project Contract Administrator, with McFarland Johnson, Inc. who provided some background on the bridge project. The structure will also carry an 8" gas main, 12" sewer main and a 16" insulated and heated water main in addition to fire alarm power.

Also visited during last year's Construction Day, this year's participants got a birds-eye view of the project when the bus parked in the middle of the west side of South Main St. Ed Roberge, PE and City Engineer for the City of Concord, hopped on the bus for a brief rundown of the project which proposes to improve an 11-block section of Main Street. The project is about 3,800 linear feet in length and converts the four-lane roadway section to a two-lane with a traversable, center median with the ultimate goal of providing safe access for all users.

It was an adventurous trip with lots of activities planned for the day. The weather cooperated but it sure was a hot one! Thank you to each of the site coordinators who help provide detail at each of the stops and to all of our attendees that participated in this year's event. 
